BACKYARD NATURE HUNT

A flower you didn't plant (wild flower) 	A bird singing in a tree	A pollinator who can lift 10-50 times her own weight (ant)	A place where wild bees might dig a hole to nest (bare patch of soil)
An insect with wings, who used to be a caterpillar (butterfly) 	Something birds love to feed their babies (caterpillar)	A baby plant (seedling)	A tree leaf with lobed edges 
Flowers with at least two pollinators visiting them	The seed pod from a pine tree 	A large bee with a "furry rear" (bumble bee)	A shadow cause by a tree
Tree bark that feels smooth when you touch it	A tiny red beetle with black spots who is good for gardens	Something that provides shelter for insects and small animals (stick or log pile)	A place where butterflies might stop to sip nutrients (mud puddle)
A pollinator from Europe brought to make honey (honey bee)	An insect who resembles a bee but has a tiny waist (wasp)	Something trees provide that helps soil stay healthy (leaf mulch)	A bee with a "shiny hiney" (carpenter bee)
